

A walk around the College Lane Campus

1 Main Reception – The first point of call for most visitors. Adjacent to reception are the Prince Edward Hall and Chapman Lounge used for lectures, examinations and functions including UH Arts events.

2 Innovation Centre – This facility is an integral part of the business and financial aspect of the University of Hertfordshire. A large group of offices is available to rent to young, knowledge based companies – a place where academia and business gain from positive interaction, demonstrating the close relationship between a modern university and the world of business and commerce.

3 Automotive Centre – Our students get the opportunity to work on special projects such as the Formula Student car and the Europa and Vampire aircraft. The University has over 30 years experience of producing automotive engineers. Almost every Formula One racing car team has one of our graduates in their design team.

4 CP Snow – This building houses the School of Life Sciences including Sports and Exercise Science, Geography, Pharmacology, Biosciences, and many Environmental courses as well as Psychology. Most of the building consists of laboratories and tutors' offices.

5 Buxton Centre for Learning – The Buxton Centre for Learning is the largest Learning Resources Centre in the UK. It is open 24 hours a day, seven days a week and has 1,600 study places with 800 computer workstations. There are group study rooms, single study rooms and a café study area. Access is provided to all University on-line services as well as printing, photocopying facilities, video studios and a multimedia suite. There are book and journal collections which cover the schools based on the College Lane Campus.

6 Health Research Building – The University's £30 million Health Sciences building offers a state-of-the-art environment for education and training in this fast-changing sector.

Here a special simulation centre features intensive care and ward areas, pharmacies, a GP surgery, counselling and observation rooms, as well as the very latest in audio-visual technology and conference facilities.

Many more world-class resources help students to progress their studies and present coursework professionally. These include hi-spec laboratories and hi-tech computing suites.

7 Telford Court – Telford Court is the most modern hall on the College Lane campus, with eleven blocks of seven or eight self-contained flats. Each flat accommodates six people in single rooms, has a large communal kitchen, three spacious showers and two toilets. All rooms have hand washbasins.

8 Key – The Key is the University's multifaith worship building. It is used by all denominations that wish to partake in religious activities. It is also a place for meditation or just somewhere to reach your inner pool of calm!

9 Students' Union – The University of Hertfordshire Students' Union offers advice and support for students, an employment and lettings office and over 50 clubs and societies for all their interests and needs, not to mention the newly refurbished EleHouse, our local pub on campus, and the newly built state of the art entertainment venue the Forum (9).

10 Forum – Boasting seven separate spaces, the Forum is a focal point for the University of Hertfordshire community.

From big-name headliners to intimate shows and an informal study space, the Forum has been designed to be as flexible as possible to cater for the widest range of interests.

11 Student Centre – The Student Centre is an integrated "one-stop-shop" for the main administrative departments dealing with students - in here you can access the University Admissions Service, Student Finance, Student Registry, Residential Allocations, the International Office and the Cash Office. Here you can get a prospectus, apply for a course, receive visa advice, get a council tax letter, enquire about the availability of Halls of Residence, pay fees and ask about Student Loans. Normal opening hours are 9.30 - 4.00 (3pm on Fridays).

12 Art and Design – The School of Creative Arts has been designed and built to meet the needs of students and includes workshops, studios and computer suites which are well equipped with all the latest technologies. The gallery regularly holds exhibitions featuring local, national and international artists and of course the work of our own students. The School of Creative Arts is set to grow even more in the future so watch this space!

13 Film, Music and Media Building – Hertfordshire is home to the majority of the UK's media production. We have strong links with the major film and TV studios, all located within 45 minutes of our campus. The new Film, Music and Media building boosts state of the art workshops and media facilities.

A Roberts Way – Roberts Way consists of houses for eight people comprising six single and one double room with bunk beds. Some of the houses have a hand washbasin in each rooms.

B John Lill Centre – The John Lill Centre is the central area for composition, commercial composition where music is made for TV, film, as well as song writing, recording, music publishing, and the Internet. We are regularly visited by leading international performers. The School of Creative Arts has a particular commitment to the integration of new computer and electronic technologies in music, creative music-making and composition.

C Halls – Chapman, Broad, Coales and Fern Halls are older style halls where a large kitchen is shared between twelve rooms off a corridor. The majority are single rooms but Butler, Fern and Chapman Halls contain some double room.
