De Havilland Campus Tour Instructions

- Meet guests inside The Enterprise Hub on de Havilland marked with point 1 on the map below. Explain the Enterprise Hub to guests using cribcards.
- Head to the law court building (point2) and walk into the building and read out the crib cards.
- Head towards the Ashwell building (Flat 1, Room 1 & 4) and show them the rooms.
- Head towards the canteen (point 4) and read out the crib cards when passing by.
- Follow the route to The Sports Village (point 5) and walk into the building before the barriers and readout the crib cards.

- Walk down to the Institute of Sport building (point 6) and stand in the building to read the crib cards.
- Head to point 7 (The Atrium and Weston Auditorium) and use the crib cards to help you explain these locations.
- After, walk up to the LRC (point8) and stand inside just before the barriers and read the crib cards and talk about your experience with the LRC.
- Head back to the EnterpriseHub (point 1) and ask attendees if they have any final questions.


