PATHWAYS – Full & Part Time options

- Flexible blended learning
- You can study full-time over one year; or part-time over two or more years
- MSc Sustainable Planning has Three Pathways:
 - Sustainable Planning
 - Sustainable Planning & Transport
 - Sustainable Planning & Environmental Management

MSc Transport Planning also has Three Pathways

- MSc Transport Planning
- MSc Transport Planning with Advanced Research (requires a separate application) – for those considering a PhD or with a Research Interest
- MSc Transport Planning (Sandwich) with work Placement (only for September entrants)

Three options for Study

MSc Transport Planning 12-14 month programme - For all interested in Transport Planning

MSc Transport Planning (Sandwich) with 30 week work placement – For those interested in gaining work experience towards building a professional career

MSc Transport Planning with Advanced Research with a Research Internship with the Smart Mobility Unit – For those who wish to work towards a PhD/build a research career. This requires completion of an in-depth piece of research

Introducing the MSc Programmes

There are two intakes each year in September and January

Teaching is in a modular (Block Teaching) form with 2-3 day modules, generally on a Thursday to Saturday with other Tutorials, Research Methods and Study Skills on other weekdays

Cohorts are a mix of International & home students from undergraduate course and experienced professionals looking to add to their qualifications or learn new skills

The Academic Year for the MSc runs over 3 Semesters e.g. 2023/24

Resources

Qualified Staff and Guest Lecturers in current professional practice/senior industry experts

Rooms (GIS Lab)/recorded & online delivery

Technology Platforms (Public Engagement Software/GIS etc...)

More engagement with staff and guests


Students are a mix of graduates and professionals = shared experiences and connections

Why study a postgraduate degree?

Career satisfaction: Postgraduates are 4% more likely to think that their current employment is meaningful than graduates.

Earning potential: Masters graduates earn on average £5,600 more per annum than first degree holders, five years after graduation.

Job status: 18% more likely to be in a highly-skilled role with a postgraduate qualification



How to Fund Postgraduate Study



How to fund your postgraduate study - PG Loan

The UK Government provides postgraduate loans of up to £11,836.

Your loan repayments will be calculated on a rate of 6% of any income you earn over £21,000.

Loan eligibility requirements:

- Applicants are under 60 years old
- Are a UK national and have lived in the UK for three years before studying
- EU national residing in England with settled status under the EU Settlement Scheme and have been ordinarily resident in the EEA or Switzerland for three years
- Will be studying a full-time course lasting one or two years or studying a part-time course that is no longer than twice the length of the full-time equivalent course
- Applicants should not already have a Master's or equivalent qualification

How to apply for a postgraduate degree at Herts

1. Check the entry requirements of the course you are applying for (found on course pages online)

2. Prepare all the information required before starting the application

3. Apply online – Most postgraduate courses can be applied for directly on our website through the course page.

4. Keep an eye on your email – if we require any additional information from you this will be sent via email

Personal Statement

One of the most vital parts of your application is your postgraduate personal statement. It is used to understand your motivations for studying and determining your **suitability**.

When considering what to include, think about the following:

- Your reason for applying for the course
- Academic achievements
- •Your career aspirations and how the course fits in with this
- •Relevant non-academic experience (hobbies, interests, clubs, societies & voluntary work)
- •Work experience
- •Your reason for applying to the University of Hertfordshire
