

Amendments to UPR AS11 (Schedule of Awards) for 2021/22

This paper summarises the approved amendments to UPR AS11 for the 2021/22 academic year.

1. Permanent relaxation of Sandwich Award requirements

Previously, UPR AS11 identified that a sandwich award required the successful completion of at least 36 weeks full-time equivalent placement activity from a maximum of two separate approved placements. If students did not accumulate 36 weeks then there were three options within the regulations:

- To award a degree 'with Employment Experience' if the student has accumulated at least 12 weeks of experience;
- If they have completed between 12 and 35 weeks of experience, the balance could be made up by a separate 12-week (minimum) placement;
- Revert to a non-Sandwich route.

However, many placement students were leaving their placements early because of the Covid-19 outbreak. It was agreed that the University should be more flexible with respect to students who could not complete their 36 weeks. The following temporary arrangements were agreed for 2019/20 and 2020/21, in these exceptional times:

- Reduction of the 36-week minimum requirement to 30 weeks minimum (in line with the requirements of most other Universities);
- In exceptional circumstances, the Director of Academic Quality Assurance is able to approve a Sandwich award where a student has accumulated down to the 24 weeks placement activity, which is the HESA minimum expectation of a Sandwich Year.

The temporary amendment to the regulations reassured students finishing their placement early, and those wanting to but worried of the consequences of doing so. However, UH Careers and Employment service reported increasing difficulties for students to secure Sandwich placements in the current environment. This situation is unlikely to improve in the foreseeable future. The following permanent amendment has therefore been approved to UPR AS11, section 2.4:

2.4 Award titles acknowledging employment experience

2.4.1 Sandwich awards

A sandwich award requires the successful completion of at least **30** weeks full-time equivalent placement activity from a maximum of two separate approved placements, neither of which will be normally less than **12** weeks in duration, in order for the award to be made. The sandwich award title should be:

<Award title (Sandwich)>

*In exceptional circumstances, the Director of Academic Quality Assurance is able to approve a Sandwich award for the successful completion of at least **24** weeks full-time equivalent placement activity.*

2. Approval of two-year taught Master's degrees

A number of full-time, two-year Master's degrees have been approved by the University's Academic Development Committee (ADC) in the past three years, primarily to attract the international market. These awards have been distinguished from standard one-year Master's degrees through the use of the following adjuncts:

- Award (Sandwich)
- Award 'with Advanced Research'
- Award 'with Research'
- Award 'with Further Study'

The Sandwich award is achieved through the successful completion of a two or three Semester placement. However, the other awards are achieved through the successful completion of an additional 60 credits of level 7 taught or project/dissertation modules (in order to meet the expectations of full-time study and therefore satisfy UKVI rules).

These requirements have been formalised in the University's regulations, to avoid confusion where Schools are applying for ADC initial approval of a new two-year Master's degree. The following amendments have been approved to UPR AS11, section 4.3:

3. Master of Business Administration (MBA)

The following amendments have been approved to UPR AS11, section 4.3, to more clearly distinguish between the Executive and non-Executive routes on the University's MBA programme:

4.3 Master's degrees (taught)

4.3, C Master of Business Administration (Executive) (MBA Executive)

The title 'MBA (Executive)' is reserved for programmes which focus on the general principles and functions of management and the development of management skills. Students entering MBA (Executive) programmes ~~must have appropriate practical experience and should normally be at least 23 years old on admission. should normally have at least three (3) years relevant experience in a management role.~~

4.3, D Master of Business Administration (MBA)

The title 'MBA' is reserved for programmes which focus on the general principles and functions of management and the development of management skills.

~~Students entering MBA programmes should normally have a first degree at 2:2 or above and at least three (3) years relevant experience in a management role.~~

4. Doctorate in Health and Social Care (DHaSC)

To note the approval of the Doctorate in Health and Social Care (DHaSC), as recommended by the Research Degrees Board. The following amendment has been approved to UPR AS11, section 3.4:
