60% of Scope 3 carbon emissions from visitor attractions are from cars

22% of UK households don't have a car (15 million people)

Results so far

- 3000 people a week using Good Journey to plan car-free visits
- All RHS Gardens offering 30% discount for car-free visitors
- Pilot with 10 National Trust sites, extended to 50 for 2024
- Pilots with English Heritage and Historic Environment Scotland
- Norfolk became first Good Journey County in 2023, to be followed by Suffolk in 2024






Around 500 visitors a week plan car-free travel to Blenheim with Good Journey.

Blenheim have increased car-free visitors from 5000 to 41,000 a year.

They now aim for 50% of visitors to make carbon-friendly journeys by 2027.

Piloted hourly shuttle bus from Woking station, with 15-seater community transport minibus.

Attracting 3000 passenger in 2022, increasing to 8000 in 2023.

The local council has now agreed to run the service in 2024 with a 60-seater bus.







4km traffic-free path from Aylesbury Vale Parkway to Waddesdon Manor.

Opened in 2018 and used by 70,000 people in the first year.

Illustrates scope for attracting people to cycle to attractions near towns or cities.







Future ambitions

Scale up work with National Trust and other national organisations.

Establish discounted combined train-bus-entry tickets to attractions.

Make it the norm for attractions to welcome car-free visitors.
