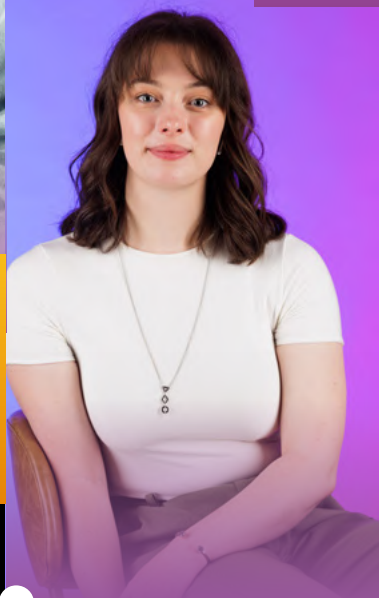

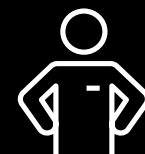

Loans to support you

- A student loan is available from the Student Loans Company to cover your course tuition.
- You may also be eligible for a maintenance loan to support with the cost of living (such as accommodation, food and travel).
- Repayments won't start until you earn over £25,000.



Scholarships and bursaries

- Scholarships and bursaries can further support the cost of university – these don't need to be paid back.

Types of courses

Whatever your dream, we're here to help you achieve it.

Foundation and extended degrees

Alternative entry routes with lower entry requirements:

- **Foundation degree**

A two-year course with a standalone qualification. Progress to the second or final year of a BA/BSc at Herts.

- **Extended degree**

Includes an initial year to prepare you for the first year of a degree at Herts.

Bachelor's degree – the most common type of degree

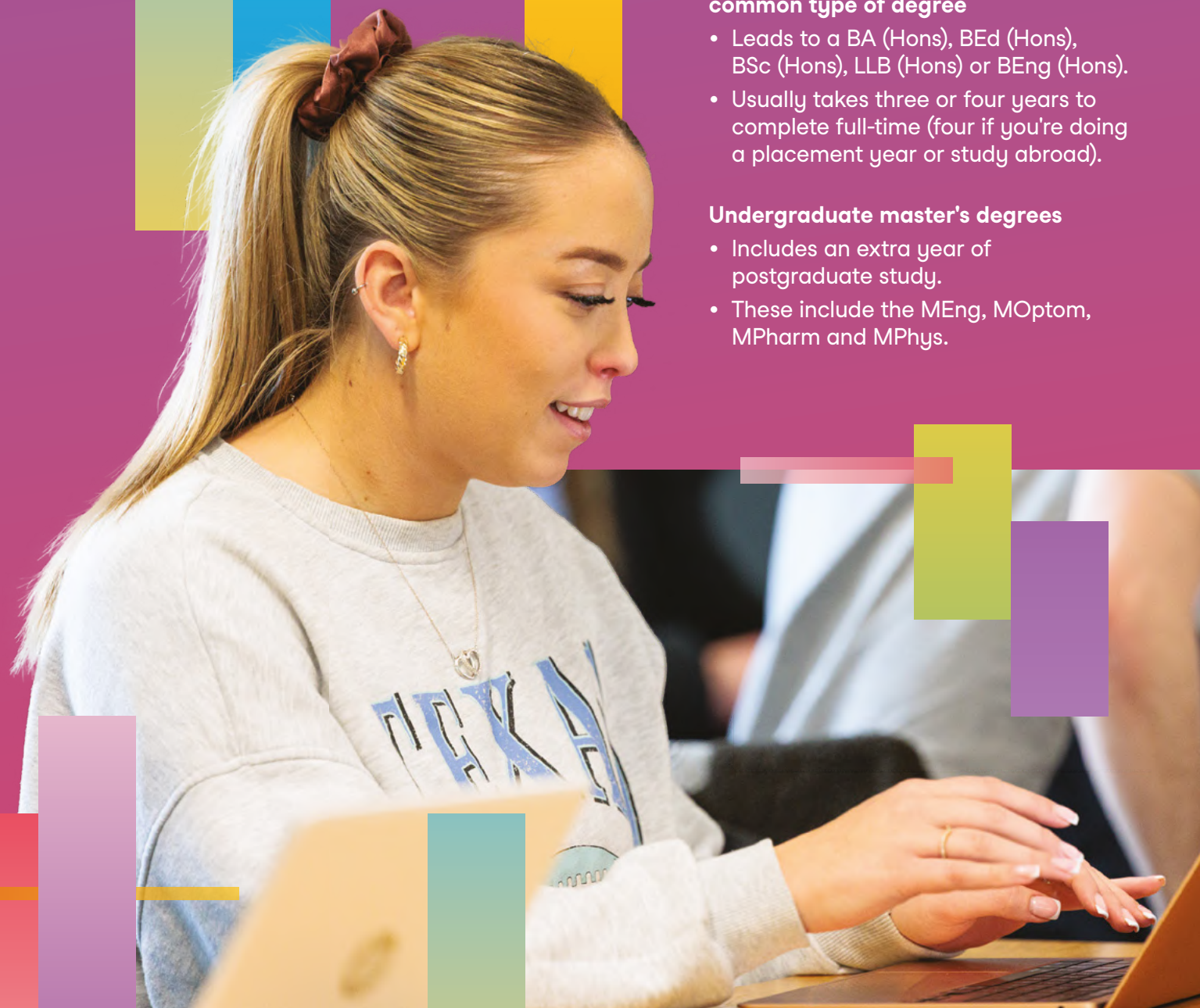
- Leads to a BA (Hons), BEd (Hons), BSc (Hons), LLB (Hons) or BEng (Hons).
- Usually takes three or four years to complete full-time (four if you're doing a placement year or study abroad).

Undergraduate master's degrees

- Includes an extra year of postgraduate study.
- These include the MEng, MOptom, MPharm and MPhys.

This undergraduate guide is for prospective students interested in a course at the University of Hertfordshire starting September 2026. Your relationship with us

If you wish to study with us, you will need to make a formal application, following which we will inform you whether we are able to offer you a place. If you accept, you will become a member of a community that enjoys many rights and privileges. These rights and responsibilities form part of the contractual relationship that will exist between us. Further information is in our Key Facts document, available at herts.ac.uk/study/how-to-apply/your-offer-package.

The education we provide

Our goal is to ensure you are taught, supervised, assessed and supported by staff who are appropriately qualified and experienced, taking into account your needs, the needs of other students and the nature of your course. We will use every reasonable effort to provide your educational and other related services in the manner and to the standards set out in our prospectuses, on our website and in our other published materials. We recognise you expect to receive the educational service you are paying for; however, there may be circumstances outside our reasonable control which have a detrimental effect on how we provide our services to you or mean that we have to make changes to the way in which we provide the services to you. These could include, for example, industrial action (except by members of our own staff), health and safety or public health issues or restrictions, civil commotion, severe weather conditions, changes in the law and/or actions taken by a government or public authority, damage or destruction to our buildings or facilities, or interruption or failure of utility services. If circumstances such as these arise, we will inform you as soon as reasonably practicable and will use every reasonable effort to minimise any adverse effect it may have on you. The Covid-19 pandemic situation is an example of a situation outside our reasonable control in which we have had to make appropriate but material changes to the way we deliver our services in order to ensure we can continue to deliver high-quality provision, but also protect your health and safety and meet government requirements. In the circumstances of an international public health emergency, the University will continue to make all reasonable efforts to provide high-quality teaching and support for students, in accordance with government and public health advice.

Changes to your course or modules

Although it is never something we do lightly, we may in certain circumstances, make changes to advertised content or structure or methods of delivery of your course or individual modules after you have accepted an offer, which may include discontinuing a module. If we make a change (other than one which is minor or insignificant) before you start, we will inform you as soon as reasonably practicable so you can decide whether you still wish to study with us. If as a consequence you decide not to, we will refund any tuition fees and / or deposit you have paid in advance in respect of the course in question. If we decide to make a change (other than one which is minor or insignificant) after you have registered, we will similarly inform you as soon as reasonably practicable, and we will use every reasonable effort to minimise any adverse effect it may have on you. If in spite of our efforts the change is likely to have a serious adverse effect (for example, by prejudicing your future choice of career), we will try to find you a suitable alternative course or module with us or (if you prefer) we will try to suggest a suitable alternative course with another education provider. In the case of a material change to a course or module, we will also consult with student representatives with a view to identifying options for, and minimising any adverse effect on, affected students. Some optional modules may have capacity issues and therefore, we may not be able to guarantee you a place on your first choice.

Discontinuing your course

Sometimes we can only run an advertised course if certain conditions are fulfilled – for example, sufficient students make the course financially viable. Your 'About Your Course' factsheet (which you will find on the relevant page on our website) will set out any such conditions which apply to your course. If we cancel your course before the start of your studies, we will inform you as soon as practicable and we will refund any tuition fees or deposit you may have paid in advance. Where practical, we will also try to find you a suitable alternative course with us or offer you the opportunity to defer your entry to a subsequent intake. In exceptional circumstances, we may have to merge or even discontinue a course once you have started your studies. In these circumstances we will inform you as soon as practicable and we will use every reasonable effort to minimise the impact it has on you. Where appropriate, we will try to find you a suitable alternative course with us or (if you prefer) we will try to suggest a suitable alternative course with another education provider. If you do transfer to another education provider in these circumstances, we will co-operate with your new provider in respect of any transfer of credit/academic progress. If you do not transfer to an alternative course either with us or with another provider, we will keep a record of your credit / academic progress in case you return to higher education in the future. Any entitlement you may have to a refund in tuition fees in either of these situations will be determined in accordance with our Fees and Finance Policy.
