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The role of Primary Care

To address health inequalities for people with an intellectual disability

- Increased risk premature mortality
- Increased number of co-morbidities
- Barriers to accessing healthcare
- Difficulty accessing health information
- Lower uptake of screening and immunisations
- Increased risk of abuse, neglect and exploitation

What does Primary Care provide?

Care

- Continuity
- Know person/ family/carers
- Holistic approach
- Used to complexity, uncertainty and risk
- Used to looking after people not directly visible to us
- Local knowledge of services and providers
- Access to social prescribing and community initiatives
- Referral to specialist care

Place

- Close to home
- Accessible
- Home visits if needed
- Lead GP for LD
- LD administrator
- Reasonable adjustments
- Accessible information
- LD Register
- Multi-agency working
- Primary Care Networks

Information


- Consultations and documents in one place

Annual Health Checks

- Pre-check accessible questionnaire
- Gather and record information about support/care
- Record sensory needs and reasonable adjustments
- Bloods, BP, weight
- Health promotion
- Screening
- Immunisations



Annual Health Checks

- Systems review and examination
- Chronic disease management
- Medication review
- Syndrome specific checks
- Primary and secondary prevention CVD
- Health Action Plan
- Safeguarding
